Concert of work by patron Karl Jenkins

A choir of local young girl choristers from St Thomas-on-the-Bourne, Farnham, together with treble soloist Sam Dashwood from St Edmund's School, Hindhead, have been specially selected and trained to perform sections of the

The programme also includes Jenkins' dynamic violin concerto, 'Sarikiz', with Kazakhstan's violin virtuoso soloist Marat Bisengaliev, for whom the work was written, and will be conducted by the composer himself.

The concert opens with 'Hymn to the Word', for chorus and orchestra by Haslemere's rising young composer Clive Osgood, specially selected by organisers to complement the programme.

"This is another ambitious Grayshott event, packed with wonderful music and performed by a host of talented musicians," said artistic director, Vivien Harrison.
